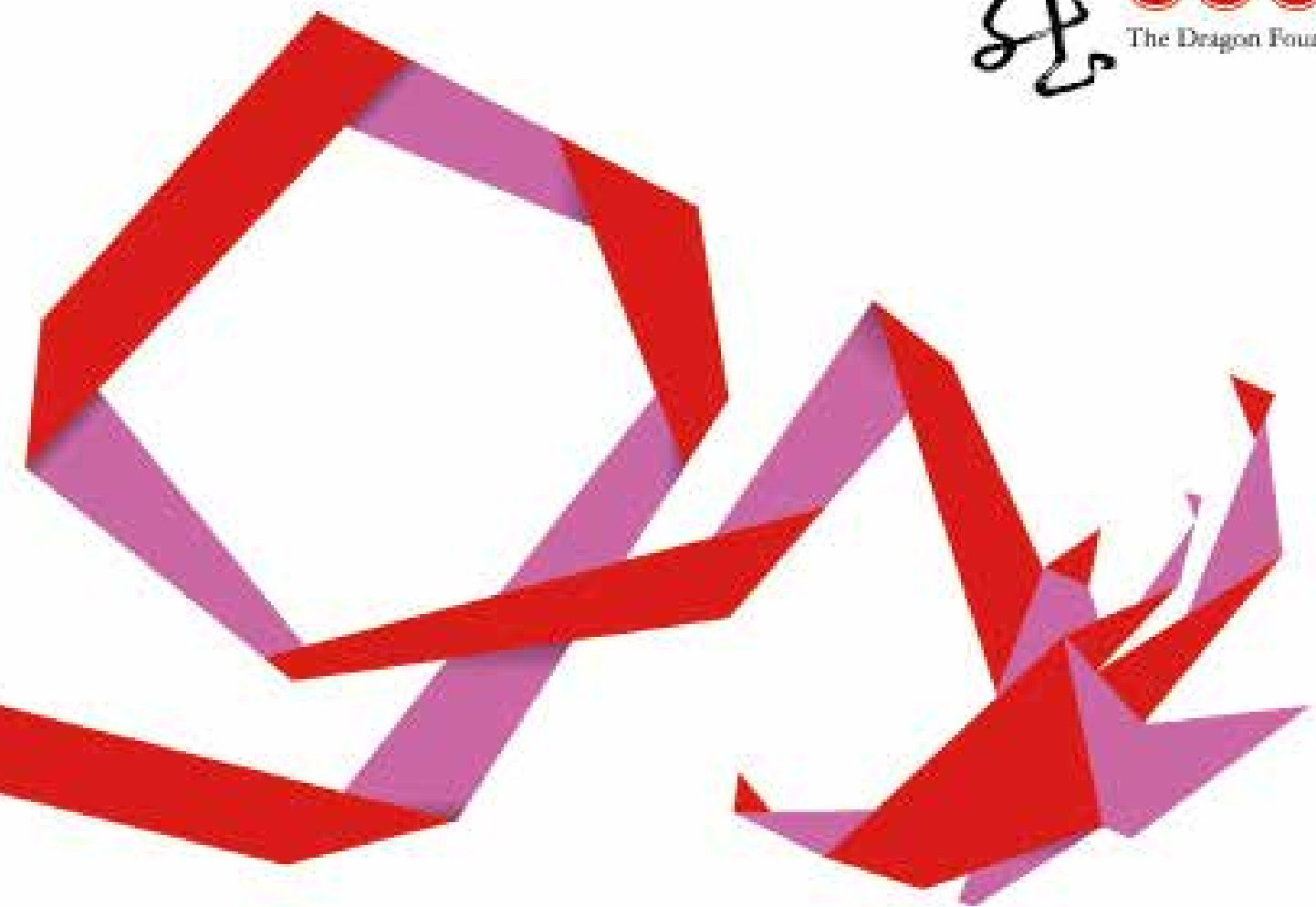

well as historical treasures of the city. It was deeply gratifying to hear how much the delegates enjoyed the trip and to hear of their insights which they will take home to share with others.



About The Dragon Foundation

The year 2000 saw both the start of the new millennium and, according to the Chinese calendar, the Year of the Dragon. To commemorate these auspicious events, The Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups, the Home Affairs Bureau of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) Government and The All-China Youth Federation co-organised the ***Dragon at the Great Wall – Commemorating the New Millennium: a Vision for Youth***.

This special project included a youth conference, ***Meeting the Challenges of the New Millennium***, which discussed issues on the theme of ***Visualising the Trends of Global Development and the Challenges of the 21st Century***. Held at the Great Hall of the People in Beijing and attended by more than 3,000 Chinese youth from across the globe, the event culminated in raising a 10,000-foot-long dragon at the Great Wall which then successfully broke the current Guinness World Record for the longest dragon dance.

Following this successful event, and with community support and encouragement, The Dragon Foundation was set up, taking forward the aims manifested by ***the Dragon at the Great Wall***. The Foundation was established in Hong Kong and inaugurated on 12 February 2000. The Honourable Tung Chee-hwa, the then Chief Executive of the HKSAR, and The Honourable Elsie Leung, the then Chief Justice of the HKSAR, officiated at the Inaugural Ceremony.

The Foundation was incorporated under the Companies Ordinance and registered as a non-profit, charitable organisation. Its fundamental objectives are to develop leadership skills and nurture innovative and creative talent among ethnic Chinese youth around the world, while encouraging and facilitating exchange networks amongst them. The Foundation also nurtures a spirit of service and civic responsibility in the community. It recognises the outstanding achievements of youth in various professions. The Foundation's Board of Directors includes representatives of The Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups, the HKSAR Government, and prominent leaders from various sectors of the community. The Foundation's Secretariat is administered by The Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups.

Vision

To facilitate networks among Chinese youth worldwide, to promote Chinese culture and heritage, and instil the spirit of service and responsibility.

Objectives

The Dragon Foundation aims :

- ▶ to develop leadership skills
- ▶ to establish an exchange network among Chinese youth
- ▶ to facilitate the development of innovative potential
- ▶ to provide opportunities and ways to serve the community

The Secretariat

There were some changes in Secretariat staff in the year under review. In May 2016, Ms. Carrie Wong was seconded to be the Secretary-General. We thank Ms. Yolanda Chiu for her service and hard work. In spite of all these changes, the Secretariat used its simple structure and continued to execute its day-to-day operations with the same commitment and dedication as in the past.

Financial Results

The audited financial statements of the Foundation for the financial year 2016/17 were prepared by auditors, Li, Tang, Chen & Co., and are attached herewith. The accounts show a total revenue of HK\$1,188,097 against total operating expenses of HK\$3,470,273, resulting in an expenditure excess of HK\$2,282,176. This balance will be transferred to the Accumulated Fund.

The total reserves of the Foundation as at 31 March 2017 were HK\$20,402,731.

Highlights of the Year

1. Dragon 100 - 2016

The theme for the 2016 Dragon 100 programme was “Dragons on The Silk Road: Exploring Opportunities Under China’s Belt and Road Initiative”. The programme was sponsored by Ng Teng Fong Charitable Foundation Limited and was held with the support from the “One Belt One Road One Friendship” Project of The Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups. The programme was held from 31 July to 7 August, which included a three-day stay in Hong Kong and a five-day study tour in Shenzhen and Xi’an. 100 delegates from 14 countries and regions, aged from 18 to 40, had been selected.

As a results of the theme, the programme attracted many young entrepreneurs. Out of the 100 selected delegates, 27 were operating their own businesses, while 73 were still in the process of developing their business plans. Their businesses covered various industries including education, personal development, innovation and technology, as well as food and beverage.

The Delegation Leader was Ms. Shelley Lee, Director of The Dragon Foundation, while Dr. Rosanna Wong, DBE, JP, Director of The Dragon Foundation and Executive Director of The Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups was the Delegation Advisor.





The Commissioning Ceremony was jointly organised with the “One Belt One Road One Friendship” Project. Professor the Hon. K C Chan, GBS, JP, Secretary for Financial Services and the Treasury of the HKSAR Government, was the Guest of Honour.



After the Ceremony, delegates attended topical speech sessions delivered by renowned speakers to learn about the Belt and Road initiative from economical and historical perspectives.





While in Xi'an, delegates visited the Xi'an Hi-tech Industries Development Zone and the Xi'an International Trade & Logistics Park.



Not only did they explore the development trends and opportunities in Xi'an, they also discussed with local entrepreneurs and learn from their success stories.



Furthermore, they had the privilege to visit cultural sites, including The Museum of the Qin Terra-cotta Warriors and Horses, the Shaanxi History Museum and the Tang West Market Museum.



As in the past, delegates were encouraged to join the Foundation's alumni associations, "DragoNation" and "Envision Hong Kong" to sustain the "Dragon 100" spirit and to contribute to the sustainable development in their own professional fields continually.



2. Global Youth Entrepreneurs Forum 2016



The Global Youth Entrepreneurs Forum 2016 was co-organised by the Foundation, The Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups (HKFYG), the Shenzhen Youth Federation and the Qianhai Shenzhen-Hong Kong Youth Innovation and Entrepreneur Hub (E Hub). The Forum was sponsored by Victor and William Fung Foundation Limited.



The forum attracted over 1,000 participants from 25 countries and regions, including Dragon 100 delegates. On 3 August, participants attended a forum at the Qianhai Shenzhen-Hong Kong Youth Innovation and Entrepreneur Hub (E Hub) across the border. The theme for the year was “From Start-up to Scale-up: Igniting Innovation”, about 20 concurrent speeches, dialogue sessions and a pitching session were conducted, over 50 speakers shared their start-up insights with the participants. Special focus was placed on the challenges and opportunities of FinTech technologies, brand building and social innovation. At the end of the day, youth start-upers pitched their business plans and ideas to receive feedback from judges.

3. Golf Tournament at Mission Hills Golf Club 2016

The Golf Tournament was held on 15 April 2016 at Mission Hills Golf Club Dongguan Clubhouse. 32 teams with 127 players had joined the game. Over \$390,000 net proceeds were made from the tournament which helped finance the leadership programmes of the Foundation.



The Organising Committee was led by Chairman Mr. Tenniel Chu and Vice Chairman Mr. Christopher Lau, with the participation of Ms. Junia Ho, Mr. Ricky Lam, Dr. Tang Kam Hung and Mr. Stephen Yeung for their hard work in inviting golf teams, in-kind and advertisement sponsors.



The Hon Jeffrey Lam Kin-fung, GBS, JP, Non-official Member, Executive Council, the Government of the HKSAR, Mr. Peter Wong Tung-shun, JP, Deputy Chairman and Chief Executive, The Hongkong and Shanghai Banking Corporation Ltd. and Mr. Robert Chan Hing-cheong, Former Chairman, Hong Kong Economic Journal Co. Ltd. were our officiating guests.



4. Sponsoring youth film “The Taste of Youth” for The Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups

The documentary film “The Taste of Youth (少年滋味)” that was partially sponsored by The Dragon Foundation, was successfully produced by The Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups. The film was directed by Golden Horse Award winning Director, Mr. Cheung King-wai, comprised of stories of nine young people which reflected their frustration, aspiration and relationship with schools and parents.



The Gala Premiere was held on 27 May 2016 at AMC Pacific Place Cinema. The Hon John Tsang Chun-wah, GBM, JP, Financial Secretary of the HKSAR Government was the Guest of Honour. Furthermore, The Foundation also sponsored special movie screenings for parents, students and teachers from May to August 2016.



5. Alumni Association

5.1 DragoNation

DragoNation, the alumni association made up of past participants of previous Dragon Foundation programmes, held its annual signature event - DragoNation Forum on 28 May 2016. The theme of the Forum was “From Passion to Action: Entrepreneurship with Mission”. The DragoNation Forum was supported by CLP Power Hong Kong Limited and Institute for Entrepreneurship of The Hong Kong Polytechnic University.



Over 100 participants attended the Forum. The keynote speech was given by Mr. Francis Ngai, Chief Executive Officer, Social Ventures Hong Kong, and 9 alumni from different industries were invited to join the group sharing sessions. The sharing of The Hon. Sir T.L. Yang inspired many aspiring alumni who wish to become entrepreneurs.



Another signature event series and three diversity chambers were held throughout the year. On 8 April 2016, Dragons visited the Photography & Heritage Conservation site at Happy Valley. Mr. Douglas So, founder of the F11 Foto Museum, Vice-president and Pro-Vice-Chancellor of The University of Hong Kong, shared his dedication to photography and heritage conservation.



On 29 October 2016 and 7 January 2017, Dragons visited Club of The Helena May in Central and the Zero Carbon Building at Kowloon Bay. Mr. Kingsley Ng, an inter-disciplinary artist and Assistant Professor at the Academy of Visual Arts, Hong Kong Baptist University, spoke about art. Mr. Tony Ip, Deputy Director of the Sustainable Design from Ronald Lu & Partners led a walking tour around Kowloon Bay and spoke about sustainable design concepts. Both Kingsley and Tony were Dragon 100 delegates in 2011.



DragoNation members also supported The HKFYG Neighbourhood First Reunion Lunch (鄰舍團年飯) at Tung Chung on 14 January 2017 to celebrate Lunar New Year with about 300 residents.



With support from Ms. Junia Ho Suk-yin, JP, Vice-President of the Programme and Fund Raising Committee, DragoNation launched a six-month Mentorship Programme. Mentors include Ms. Ho herself and seven alumni from different fields, namely Education, Youth Development, Social Welfare, Architecture, Philanthropy, Creative Branding and Design, Consultancy, Arts and Entrepreneurship. The kick-off ceremony was held on 31 March 2017.



Members of DragoNation were scattered around the world in over 30 cities and countries. Re-union activities were held outside Hong Kong, including Singapore and Taiwan. Ms. Shelley Lee, GBS, OBE, JP, Director of The Dragon Foundation, met with Singapore Dragons for a quality small group discussion on 10 December 2016.





Apart from social gatherings, Dragons also demonstrated the sense of social responsibility by volunteering in the community. Young Dragons volunteered at On Tat Estate as children's tutors and playmates, and a project in Yunnan for less privileged was carried out by collaboration between Dragons in Hong Kong and Mainland China.



5.2 Envision Hong Kong

In 2009, a new organisation “Envision Hong Kong” was set up by several active members of the DragoNation. It was established to support the sustainable development of the community by engaging young professionals in youth development activities.

The annual mentorship programme “Youth Envisioning Scheme (YES)” was held from July to August 2016. Around 50 mentors and mentees joined the programme under this year’s theme “Travel For Free”. Throughout the programme, mentees were encouraged to participate and contribute to different community projects as a way of boosting self-confidence and leadership and communication skills.



“YES Summit 2016” and the YES Closing Ceremony, were held on 28 August 2016. Mentors, who are mostly members from the DragoNation, shared their experiences from different professional fields.



5.3 JCI Ten Outstanding Young Persons Award to a Dragon Alumnus

Mr. Tony Ip Chung-man, a Dragon participant in 2011, was selected as one of the Ten Outstanding Young Persons by the Junior Chamber International Hong Kong in October 2016. He is the Deputy Director of Sustainable Design in Ronald Lu & Partners (HK) Limited, and was recognised for his perseverance in pursuing his dream as an architect and passion for promoting green building.



Tony is particularly skillful with interdisciplinary design collaboration for sustainable innovation. He believes that design should be “people-oriented” and green architecture should respect eco-systems and improve human wellbeing. He is passionate about promoting a sustainably built environment through involvement in different public engagement programmes. One well-known example is the first Zero Carbon Building in Hong Kong, which strives to raise community awareness about sustainable living.
