With the establishment of DragoNation Overseas Chapters, the alumni base continues to grow and flourish as they make contributions in their home communities, while also promoting their Chinese culture and values with pride.

#### **About The Dragon Foundation**

The year 2000 saw both the start of the new millennium and, according to the Chinese calendar, the Year of the Dragon. To commemorate these auspicious events, The Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups, the Home Affairs Bureau of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) Government and The All-China Youth Federation co-organised the *Dragon at the Great Wall – Commemorating the New Millennium: a Vision for Youth.* 

This special project included a youth conference, *Meeting the Challenges of the New Millennium*, which discussed issues on the theme of *Visualising the Trends of Global Development and the Challenges of the 21<sup>st</sup> Century.* Held at the Great Hall of the People in Beijing and attended by more than 3,000 Chinese youth from across the globe, the event culminated in raising a 10,000-footlong dragon at the Great Wall which then successfully broke the current Guinness World Record for the longest dragon dance.

Following this successful event, and with community support and encouragement, The Dragon Foundation was set up, taking forward the aims manifested by the *Dragon at the Great Wall*. The Foundation was established in Hong Kong and inaugurated on 12 February 2000. The Honourable Tung Chee-hwa, the-then Chief Executive of the HKSAR, and The Honourable Elsie Leung, the-then Chief Justice of the HKSAR, officiated at the Inaugural Ceremony.

The Foundation was incorporated under the Companies Ordinance and registered as a non-profit, charitable organisation. Its fundamental objectives are to develop leadership skills and nurture innovative and creative talent among ethnic Chinese youth around the world, while encouraging and facilitating exchange networks amongst them. The Foundation also nurtures a spirit of service and civic responsibility in the community. It recognises the outstanding achievements of youth in various professions. The Foundation's Board of Directors includes representatives of The Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups, the HKSAR Government, and prominent leaders from various sectors of the community. The Foundation's Secretariat is administered by The Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups.

#### **Administrative Review**



#### The Secretariat

There were some changes in Secretariat staff in the year under review. In January 2016, Mr. Stanley To retired and Ms. Yolanda Chiu, the Deputy Executive Director of The Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups, oversaw the work of the Foundation during the period of transition. The Project Manager, Ms. Mabel Woo left and was succeeded by Ms. Kit Hau. We thank both Stanley and Mabel for their service and hard work. In spite of all these changes, the Secretariat used its simple structure and continued to execute its day-to-day operations with the same commitment and dedication as in the past.

#### **Financial Results**

The audited financial statements of the Foundation for the financial year 2015/16 were prepared by auditors, Li, Tang, Chen & Co., and are attached herewith. The accounts show a total revenue of HK\$3,961,098 against total operating expenses of HK\$5,297,269, resulting in an expenditure excess of HK\$1,336,171. This balance will be transferred to the Accumulated Fund.

The total reserves of the Foundation as of 31 March 2016 were HK\$21,803,865.

# **Highlights of the Year**

#### 1. Dragon 100 - 2015

The theme for the 2015 Dragon 100 programme was "Innovation and Entrepreneurship", which was held from 1 to 8 August and comprised a three-day stay in Hong Kong and a five-day study tour in Shenzhen and Guangzhou. Six non-ethnic Chinese youth and ten Fung Scholars were invited to join the delegation which was made up of participants aged from 18 to 40 from 17 countries or regions.

The Delegation Leader was Mr. Stanley To, Secretary-General of The Dragon Foundation, while Dr. Rosanna Wong Yick-ming, DBE, JP, Director of The Dragon Foundation and Executive Director of The Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups (HKFYG), was the Programme Advisor.

As a result of the theme, the programme attracted many young entrepreneurs. Out of the 107 selected delegates, 42 were operating their own businesses and 65 were in the process of developing a business plan. Most of the businesses were in the field of education and personal development, innovation and technology, culture and creative, as well as in the medical and health industry.

Part of the Dragon 100 programme included participating in the Global Youth Entrepreneurs Forum. The delegation joined 1,500 Forum participants at the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre and the Qianhai Shenzhen-Hong Kong Youth Innovation and Entrepreneur Hub (E Hub) on 3 and 4 August 2015 respectively.







On the first day of the Forum, delegates were greatly inspired by the Luncheon Seminar presented by Mr. Peter Wong Tung-shun, JP, Deputy Chairman and Chief Executive of The Hongkong and Shanghai Banking Corporation Limited, on opportunities in Pearl River Delta region. Expertise and views were shared by successful entrepreneurs from Hong Kong and overseas in four plenary sessions with different themes.







A Study Trip to the Mainland kick-started with the second day of the Forum in Qianhai, Shenzhen on 4 August. Problem solving tactics and approaches on business development were shared by successful young entrepreneurs at different concurrent workshops. Finally, a number of young entrepreneurs pitched their business plans in the afternoon. Please refer to P.11-12 for more details of the two-day Forum.



Ten outstanding young entrepreneurs in different field of businesses including logistics, food and beverage and innovation and technology were invited to share their stories and introduce their businesses, followed by interactive discussions with the delegation at the Qianhai Institute for Capital Management and Qianhai Houde Entrepreneur Incubator. At the Guangzhou Entrepreneur Park for Overseas Chinese Scholars, three overseas Chinese scholars who were corporate founders and/or directors, also shared the opportunities for starting up business in China after returning from overseas studies.







Delegates were also given opportunities to visit China's largest Internet Service Portal, Tencent Headquarters, and learn about its development history and internet products, and to visit The Shenzhen Institutes of Advanced Technology and explore its practices and achievements in enhancing the innovative capacity of equipment manufacturing and service industries. The group also visited cultural site at Lingnan Impression Park, a replication site reflecting traditional Chinese culture from the Yuen and Ming Dynasties. The visit concluded with a cultural performance on the last evening of the trip.









As in the past, the Dragon 100 programme spirit was sustained after the trip, with participants joining the Foundation's alumni associations, "DragoNation" and "Envision Hong Kong".





# 2. Global Youth Entrepreneurs Forum 2015

The Second Global Youth Entrepreneurs Forum was co-organised by the Foundation with The Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups (HKFYG), the Shenzhen Youth Federation and the Authority of Qianhai Shenzhen-Hong Kong Modern Service Industry Cooperation Zone of Shenzhen.

The Forum was sponsored by the Victor and William Fung Foundation Limited and The Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust. Under the theme "Growing Entrepreneurship – What Next?", this two-day global event attracted 1,600 youth participants from 20 countries or regions, and included the Dragon 100 delegates. Participants were either entrepreneurs or were creating business plans for future actualisation.



The first day of the Forum took place at the Convention Hall of the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre on 3 August. The Guest of Honour of the Forum, Professor the Hon. K C Chan, GBS, JP, Secretary of Financial Services and the Treasury, the Government of HKSAR, gave the Opening Address. The Forum was launched by prominent guests, Mr. K M Wong, BBS, JP, Director of the Victor and William Fung Foundation Limited, Mr. Zhang Shao-hui, Assistant Director of Qianhai Shenzhen-Hong Kong Modern Service Industry Cooperation Zone of Shenzhen, Ms. Cai Ying, President of Shenzhen Youth Federation, Ms. Winnie Ying Fungsau, Executive Manager of Charities of The Hong Kong Jockey Club, together with Dr. Rosanna Wong Yick-ming, DBE, JP, Director of The Dragon Foundation and Executive Director of the HKFYG, Ms. Shelley Lee Lai-kuen, GBS, OBE, JP, Director of The Dragon Foundation and the Guest of Honour. Mr. Peter Wong Tung-shun, JP, Deputy Chairman and Chief Executive of The Hongkong and Shanghai Banking Corporation Limited, spoke about innovative business opportunities in the Pearl River Delta Region during the Luncheon Seminar.







Four plenary sessions and dialogue sessions were held during the day. Successful entrepreneurs from Hong Kong and overseas shared their experiences on such topics as Challenges on "What Next"; Disruptive Business Trends: Technological Innovation; Is Social Innovation Just Hype? and How to build innovative Entrepreneurial Hub?





The second day of the Forum took place at the E Hub at Qianhai, Shenzhen on 4 August. Mr. Tian Fu, Director of the Administrative Committee, the Qianhai and Shekou Free Trade Zone and Ms. Cai Ying, President of Shenzhen Youth Federation spoke.



Participants joined the concurrent start-up workshops at four venues in the Entrepreneur Academy and the Exhibition & Entrepreneurial Service Centre. Successful entrepreneurs discussed tactics and approaches to solve problems at different stages of business development. Representatives from venture capital groups also shared about criteria of providing investment and support to start-ups. In the afternoon, a number of participants pitched business plans of their start-ups and received valuable comments and feedback from adjudicators.

# 3. "The Little Prince" Charity Première

The Charity Film Première of "The Little Prince" was held on 7 December 2015 at Broadway The ONE. The Hon. John Tsang Chun-wah, GBM, JP, Financial Secretary of the Government of HKSAR was the Guest of Honour. Professor Sophia Chan Siu-chee, JP, Acting Secretary for Food and Health of the Government of HKSAR attended as a Special Guest at the Cocktail Reception at the Prince Club.



The Event Organising Committee was led by Chairperson Dr. Jimmy Tang Kui-ming, MH, JP, Chairman and CEO of the Prince Jewellery & Watch Company, and Vice-Chairpersons Mrs. Nina Lam Lee Yuen-bing, MH and Ms. Shelley Lee Lai-kuen, GBS, OBE, JP, with Mrs. Olivia Davies, Ms. Junia Ho Suk-yin, JP, Mr. Christopher Lau Kwan, Mr. Clive Lee, Mr. Stephen Lee, Ms. Pauline So, Dr. Tang Kam-hung, MH, Dr. Albert Wong, MH, Ms. Christine Wong, Mr. David Yeung and Mr. Stanley Yeung Chee-tat, JP being the committee members.

# 4. Golf Tournament at Mission Hills Golf Club 2015

With the generous support of Mr. Tenniel Chu Ting-yiu, Vice Chairman, Mission Hills Group and Members of the Programme and Fund Raising Committee, the Foundation held its seventh Golf Tournament on 23 April 2015. 26 teams with 103 well-known local people and philanthropists were invited. As a result, close to HK\$500,000 was raised to subsidise the Foundation's leadership training programmes.







The Organising Committee was chaired by Mr. Tenniel Chu Ting-yiu, with Mr. Christopher Lau Kwan as the Vice-Chairman. Committee Members included Ms. Junia Ho Suk-yin, JP, Dr. Tang Kam-hung, MH and Mr. Stanley Yeung Chee-tat, JP.

# 5. Sponsoring youth film "The Taste of Youth" for The Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups

Last year, The Dragon Foundation partially sponsored the production of a HKFYG documentary film "The Taste of Youth (少年滋味)". Directed by Golden Horse Award winning Director, Mr. Cheung King-wai, the film comprised stories on hopes, aspirations and dreams of nine young participants from the 2013 HKFYG "Ode to Joy" Concert.





The first movie screening was held on 1 November 2015 at the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre. The Hon. Jasper Tsang Yok-sing, GBM, JP, President of the Legislative Council of Hong Kong officiated at the screening. There was an overwhelmingly positive response to the film from those in the education, social welfare and commercial sectors, as well as the general public. The film is to be released commercially from April to November 2016.



# 6. Sponsoring Hong Kong Christmas TREE Project for The Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups

The Dragon Foundation sponsored The HKFYG's Hong Kong Christmas TREE in 2015. Co-created by Architectural Designer Mr. Stanley Siu, a group of young architects from The Hong Kong Institute of Architects (HKIA) and thousands of secondary school students in Hong Kong, the "Hong Kong Christmas TREE" was made with traditional bamboo scaffolding skills and eco-friendly twinkling stars decorations recycled from 50,000 aluminum cans. The 22-metre high bamboo Christmas tree, the tallest outdoor Christmas tree in Hong Kong in the 2015's Christmas season, was exhibited at Hong Kong Cultural Centre Piazza from 19 to 26 December 2015.



On 19 December, The Hon. John Tsang Chun-wah, GBM, JP, Financial Secretary of the Government of HKSAR, was invited to officiate the Illuminating Ceremony with other officiating guests including, Dr. Peter Lam Kin-ngok, GBS, Chairman of the Hong Kong Tourism Board, Mr. Peter Wong Tung-shun, JP, Deputy Chairman and Chief Executive of The Hongkong and Shanghai Banking Corporation Limited, Mr. Chen Lin, Director General of Youth Department of Liaison Office of the Central People's Government in the HKSAR, Ms. Shelley Lee Lai-kuen, GBS, OBE, JP, Director of The Dragon Foundation, Dr. Rosanna Wong, DBE, JP, Director of The Dragon Foundation and Executive Director of the HKFYG, Mr. Vincent Ng, JP, President of HKIA and Dr. Edmund Lee, Executive Director of Hong Kong Design Centre. With festive music and vibrant lighting effects, thousands of visitors enjoyed the fabulous light show and celebrated the festive season of love and peace.







# 7. Alumni Association

#### 7.1 DragoNation

DragoNation, the alumni association for past participants of The Dragon Foundation programmes, launched its first DragoNation Forum on 30 May 2015. The theme of the Forum was Social Innovation, and it was sponsored by CLP Power Hong Kong Limited and supported by The Hong Kong University of Science and Technology Business School and MY Creative Workshop.







Over 120 participants learnt from keynote speaker Dr. K K Tse, Founding Chair and CEO of Education for Good CIC Ltd., and six renowned entrepreneurs in Hong Kong in two plenary sessions on "Leading Changes through Innovation" and "Managing User-experience and Service Innovation". By insightful sharing from Guest Speakers, Mr. David Lan Hong-tsung, GBS, ISO, JP and Ms. Shelley Lee Lai-kuen, GBS, OBE, JP, Directors of the Foundation and Ms. Junia Ho Suk-yin, JP, Vice-Chairperson of the Programme and Fund Raising Committee encouraged participants to continue making changes for a better future of the world.

To expose Dragons to diverse fields of expertise, maintain the connection among dragons and prepare them to put little ideas into changemaking initiatives to create social impacts, two sections of the Diversity Chamber were held this year. The Dragons visited well-known Information and Communications Technology (ICT) entrepreneur Mr. Alvin Lam, Group CEO of the PacificLink iMedia Group and Managing Partner of T12M Ventures Ltd. on 28 October 2015 and Ms. Connie Lee and Ms. Mazing Lee, Cofounders of the Contact Design Ltd., a lifestyle experience concept store in Hong Kong Science Park on 10 January 2016.





DragoNation members also supported the HKFYG Neighbourhood First Reunion Lunch (鄰舍團年飯) at Tung Chung on 23 January 2016 to celebrate the Lunar New Year with around 300 residents.

Members of DragoNation are now scattered around the world in over 30 cities and countries. Networking gathering were held in Australia, Korea, the United Kingdom and Taiwan. To reinforce the overseas connections, Ms. Shelley Lee Lai-kuen, GBS, OBE, JP, Director of The Dragon Foundation, attended a special networking dinner co-organised by the Foundation and DragoNation on 12 December 2015 in Singapore. Alumni from Singapore and Malaysia were eager to share their development and endeavours. Ms. Sindy Leung, President of the DragoNation 2014-2016, acted as the Ambassador of The Dragon Foundation to promote the Foundation's work to overseas partnering organisations.







#### 7.2 Envision Hong Kong

In 2009, active members of DragoNation set up a new organisation, "Envision Hong Kong" which supports sustainable development in the community by engaging young professionals in youth development activities. A large scale community-based mentorship project, the "Youth Envisioning Scheme (YES)", was then launched at local secondary schools with 88 secondary students from 12 local schools, 44 local mentors and 22 overseas mentors from over 25 countries. The theme for 2015 YES Programme was "Life Explorer" which was held from July - August 2015. Around 50 mentors and mentees joined the programme. Dragon alumni took the role as mentors and conducted a series of workshops and activities on leadership training, event management, life planning and career development and also shared their experiences of the Foundation's programmes.







#### 7.3 HKFYG Youth Service Award to a Dragon alumnus

Mr. Bird Tang Wai-wing, Dragon 100 participant in 2015, received the HKFYG Youth Service Award on 30 October 2015 in recognition of his continuous contribution to society. Bird began his international volunteer services journey after attending an inspiring workcamp in Outer Mongolia. In 2009, Bird co-founded VolTra, a charitable organisation promoting global citizenship through international volunteerism.



As the Founder and Executive Director of VolTra, Bird and his team encourage young people to cultivate a global perspective, develop empathy, learn about other cultures and mutual respect while volunteering in foreign countries. He is also the Vice President of the Network for Voluntary Development in Asia since 2014 and is responsible for promoting international volunteerism along with its member organisations in more than 20 countries.

Bird leverages his networks and resources to nurture young people with his unique philosophy: it is not a few people doing great things; but many people doing small and meaningful deeds.

#### 8.1 Dragon 100 - 2015

#### Understanding of entrepreneurship and social innovation in Hong Kong and the Mainland

"Hong Kong's entrepreneurial environment is very different from that of China. I really like the social innovation entrepreneurship here and wish that there will be more support from the government in China soon."
