1. What is the "Dragon 100"?

The "Dragon 100" is a prestigious annual programme that brings together a cohort of 100 ethnic Chinese future leaders. For one week, you'll explore cutting-edge sustainable projects, engage with experts, and build a powerful global network, all while deepening your understanding of Chinese culture and development.

4. Who We're Looking For

Eligibility: Ethnic Chinese aged 18-40.

Selection criteria include:

- Outstanding academic results or strong professional background;
- Demonstrated leadership excellence and non-academic talents;
- Track record of community service and extracurricular achievements is an advantage.





5. Programme Fees

The Programme fee is **HK\$4,000** per participant, which includes:

- All accommodation (shared room)
- All main meals and domestic transportation during the Programme
- All major entry fees and activity costs
- Travel Insurance for Programme period

Participants are responsible for covering their own costs on: transport to Hong Kong for non-Hong Kong residents; transport after dismissal in mainland China; visas and other necessary travel and health documents where applicable.

How to Apply: A Crucial Step!

This Programme requires a nomination. Your application must be supported by a nominator from your university or working institute or an established organisation who can endorse your qualities and achievements. Please submit the nomination form by email to info@dragonfoundation.net.

- 1. Find a Nominator: This is typically a professor, faculty advisor, or university administrator; your supervisor at your company; your coordinator of your volunteering organisation who knows you and your qualifications well.
